2019/20 Gas Year Export Service Offerings

At the June 6, 2019 Customer Dialogue meeting a number of items were discussed that all TransGas customers should be aware of. Customer Dialogue meetings occur quarterly; summaries of the meetings are made available to the public on the TransGas website within the [Customer Dialogue](#) section. To ensure all customers receive a consistent message from TransGas, additional information on the 2019/20 gas year export service offerings are provided in the sections below. Ongoing communication of these items will be shared with all customers as the details are finalized.

Export Service

Export Service allows customers to move their gas from the TransGas Energy Pool (TEP) to export at a variety of export points. Export service is most often offered at Empress, but may also be offered at various South Saskatchewan Delivery Area (SSDA) locations such as Bayhurst, Success, Herbert and Whitewood onto the TC Energy mainline.

Similar to how TransGas offered yearly, seasonal, and daily export throughout the 2018/19 gas year, TransGas intends to continue to offer these services for the 2019/20 gas year. A history of the firm export service offered can be found on the TransGas website within the [Firm Export Bid Summary](#) section. This webpage will continue to be updated as additional export capacity is offered and taken by customers through the export open season process. Rates for firm and interruptible export service offerings are also available on the TransGas website within the [Rates and Charges](#) section.

The availability of long term firm, short term firm and interruptible export service is based on the operation of TransGas' integrated transmission and storage system. TransGas will evaluate each type of service, and determine the duration and volume of export demand the TransGas system can reliably provide throughout the year. As outlined below, initially, lower volumes of long term firm service will be available as a baseload export offering. Next a slightly higher level of seasonal and monthly export offerings, followed by a greater level of export available daily on an interruptible basis. This strategy of providing the export offerings in tranches ensures TransGas can continue to provide a high reliability of service for our firm commitments, while allowing additional export when the supply and demand of the integrated system allows. TransGas' export offerings will be adjusted to account for weather conditions or system outages that may be experienced throughout the year. All firm export service offerings will be made available to all customers through a Binding Open Season process, and all interruptible export service will be made available through daily offerings to interested parties. Once a Binding Open Season closes, any remaining export transportation will not be available until it is offered through a subsequent Binding Open Season or through the daily interruptible service offering.

Long Term Firm Export Service

TransGas intends to offer one year firm export service (E11.0) at Empress from Nov 1, 2019 to Oct 31, 2020. This offer will be made available to all TransGas shippers through a Binding Open Season that will be issued by July 15, 2019. It is expected that the available volume will be 50 TJ/d or less. The Open Season will be emailed to all shippers and posted to the TransGas website.

Short Term Firm Export Service

Over and above the long term firm export service, TransGas intends to offer both seasonal and monthly short term firm export service through multiple Binding Open Seasons throughout the year. Seasonal export service will be offered approximately two months prior to the start of the service which typically begins November 1 for the winter season and April 1 for the summer season. Monthly export service will be offered on approximately the 15th of the month preceding the monthly firm export service offering.

The quantity of export transport made available for seasonal and monthly firm export service will depend on a number of factors related to system operation and contractual obligations, and will be determined at a later date. Based on current information, it is estimated that seasonal and monthly export service offerings could be up to 40 TJ/d in the winter season and up to 90 TJ/d in the summer season. Export locations will include both Empress and SSDA points. New short term firm export service will be an E11.1 service. If a customer wishes to convert existing D11.0 or D21.0 delivery demand to export demand it will be an E11.2 or E21.2 service respectively through the Binding Open Season.

Daily Interruptible Export Service

In addition to long and short term firm export service, interruptible (IT) daily export service (E19.0) may be offered if system operation allows for additional export above the firm export commitments. The available daily interruptible export is currently offered to customers through a daily email process, where customers have an opportunity to respond to an email issued by TransGas for next day's gas day export activity. These daily emails when IT export is available are issued only to customers who have requested to be included on the distribution list. If you are not currently on the distribution list, but are interested in receiving these emails, please email transport@transgas.com and ask to get added to the daily IT export offering list.

Based on current information it is estimated that daily IT export will range from 0-80 TJ/d, with greater levels available in the summer season when Saskatchewan delivery demand is at a lower level than in the winter season. Export locations could be at Empress or any of the SSDA export points.
